## Coming in August-September



### Dedicated Bus Lanes

B46 buses will have their own **dedicated lane**, moving passengers faster while making the street more predictable for drivers.

**New bus lanes will extend the existing bus lanes from Church Avenue to Fillmore Avenue in both directions.**

## Coming in 2015-2016



### Real Time Information

Bus Time displays and neighborhood maps are coming to most B46 SBS stops, so you'll know when the next SBS or Local bus is coming in real time.



### Faster Fare Payment

With off-board fare payment, 46,000 daily riders will pay their fare before boarding the bus with a MetroCard or coins and board through any door, greatly reducing the time waiting to pay at the front of the bus.



### Bus Priority at Lights

B46 SBS buses will be equipped with transit signal priority (TSP) technology which communicates with traffic signals so your bus spends less time waiting at traffic lights.

### Bus Bulbs (Curb Extensions)



By extending the sidewalk into the street to meet the bus, riders have more room to wait and board safely and comfortably.

# Current Bus Lanes


## Existing Utica Avenue Bus Lanes: Utica Avenue and Winthrop Street




In the summer of 2014, DOT implemented bus lanes, left-turn bays, and left-turn restrictions on Utica Avenue from St Johns Place to Church Avenue. Bus lanes were mostly placed in the “offset” position, one lane away from the curb. This design maintains curb access for parking and deliveries. As a result, both bus and vehicle travel times have decreased. In Summer 2015 DOT is extending these lanes.
