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

Mr. Sullivan began the meeting at 7:30 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance and acknowledged Bill Heaney's passing with a moment of silence.

The Committee reviewed the permit request from Artie's Steak and Seafood at 394 City Island Avenue for an unenclosed sidewalk café consisting of 7 tables and 22 chairs. This is a reduction from the existing unenclosed sidewalk café of 11 tables and 32 chairs. Mr. Chagares cited economic reasons for the reduction. The Committee approved his request.

Mr. Freda appearing for Mr. and Mrs. Petraglia presented plans for the new construction of 1018-1020 Dean Avenue—two, two family homes, on a site that was destroyed by fire. The owners want one of the homes at 1018 Dean Avenue, with plans contrary to Section 22-43 of the Zoning Resolution to be approved. The new construction does not stack the units over each other for at least 75% of the space. The owners further wish that the houses be constructed close to the original bulk of the site, and will construct a two space interior garage. They requested that the Board send a letter of support for this project to the New York City Department of City Planning. The Board approved the transmittal of a support letter.

The Committee also heard from the Akerman LLP, the Mall at Bay Plaza and The Big Rock Group of Companies, who are seeking a special permit to operate a physical cultural establishment (PCE), a gym, at the Mall in Bay Plaza at 200 Baychester Avenue, that will occupy the third and fourth floors of the enclosed mall and will contain a spa, salon, a retail area, women's and men's locker rooms, a pool, a play area for children, an aerobics and spin area, cardiovascular conditioning area, a weight room, basketball court, break room, lobby and office and storage space. The gym will operate 24 hours a day 7 days a week. The staff will number 150. The gym will be entirely contained within the enclosed portion of the Bay Plaza Mall. The applicants have requested a letter of support for granting a special permit to operate a PCE, to the New York City Board of Standards and Appeals. There was a short question and answer period regarding parking and gym fees.

The Committee approved the transmittal of a letter.

There was a short discussion concerning the La Cocina Boriqua Restaurant and the problems that it presents to the community, such as noise and rowdy, anti-social behavior by patrons. It was agreed that staff would follow-up with the owner and the SLA if necessary.

An omnibus floor Resolution was drafted representing all of the above requests:

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

The meeting was commenced by Joseph Russo, Chair, at 7:30 PM.

Applicants for four 2015 multi day Street Application Permits and one regular Street Activity Permit addressed the Committee. The following Resolution was passed and will be referred to the Full Board for its consideration.

The owner assured the Committee that he was in the process of purchasing an adjacent parking lot that will hold about 80 vehicles, and will advise the Board when the sale is complete.

A concern was discussed regarding La Cocina Boriqua, 2245B Westchester Avenue, having unruly and noisy crowds, loud music, and double parked cars. The Committee suggested a meeting with the owners at a future date.

The owner of the Coconut Palm Bar & Grill was on hand to advise the Committee that he sent an alteration document to the State Liquor Authority for a small outdoor seating area. The Committee advised him that the application was under the jurisdiction of the Dept of Consumer Affairs (DCA), and that the Board Office would contact the owner for a meeting with the Housing & Zoning Committee, when advised by DCA.



Joanne Timmins of TNCAP discussed legislation being introduced in City Council called the Social Host Law regarding the accountability of underage drinking in an individual place of residence. This law would make it a class A misdemeanor punishable by up to one year in prison and or a \$1,000.00 fine. The bill is still under review and TNCAP hopes to work with the city council in refining the bill. The committee felt that is it was proposed it would be questionable. These laws already exist in many towns throughout New York State and where they do surveys show that underage drinking is reduced. The committee will continue to follow the progress of this controversial bill.

The committee invited the nominees for the Yankee grants and reviewed the applicants. The five recipients chosen were as follows:

All of the candidates were extremely impressive and make the committee believe the future is in good hands.

In addition we would like to thank past President John Marano for continuing to work with the local schools regarding some of the parking problems. John reported to the committee that PS304 has designated a drop off zone which is helping to alleviate the problem and continuing to work with other area schools to accomplish the same.

Youth Committee 10-20-14.

We had as our guests Diana Tancredi, a parent at PS14 and Ana Tancredi, a student government representative from PS14 and Dan Racic, Principal from Bronx Delta School.

Those representing PS14 had several issues.

1<sup>st</sup> was the presence of a homeless man who has been on school property since last spring. The committee was informed that they have been working with CB 10 and the 45<sup>th</sup> precinct on this issue but the problem still exists. I spoke to Noreen at our office and she informed that they have sent out social services but the man refuses. I also spoke with community affairs and was told that a special early detail is being sent to PS14 in the morning to ask him to move along. We were informed at the meeting that the after school program gets out at 5:30 and that the homeless man is often in the area so I asked community affairs to also send the patrol car by at that time.

Another issue at PS14 was the fact that the classrooms are overheated. This is probably caused by oversized radiators in the classrooms and can be easily corrected with thermostatic radiator valves. I am asking the board office to reach out to the principal to see if we can be of help in solving this issue.

They also had complaint with the cleanliness of the cafeteria in particular the tables. We were informed that the cleaning rags when wiping down the tables are dirty rags. It was suggested that we reach out to the head dietician in this matter.

The after school program run by the YMCA has limited space and we suggested that they reach out to the beacon at IS192 to see if arrangements could be made to handle the additional needs. We should follow up with the beacon to see if they can arrange for pick up at PS14.

The after school program is also closing on days that perhaps they should not. We need to investigate their responsibilities with DYCD. As an example they plan to close at 12:30 on Halloween due to the fact that the YMCA is having a party at their main campus and needs the additional staff.

Principal Dan Racic is currently running two pre-kindergarten and two kindergarten classes at the Bronx Delta School located at the IS192 campus.

Principal Racic requested that we help them get a children's playground built on the IS192 campus. He sent me a power point presentation of what it is the school is looking for which is attached.

The committee unanimously voted on the following resolution:

Be it resolved that the youth committee of community board 10 supports the efforts of the Bronx Delta School to have a children's playground erected in the yard of IS192 located at 650 Hollywood Ave, Bronx, NY 10465 and that a letter be sent to the following: Department of Education, Department of Parks, Office of Mayor Bill de Blasio, Borough President Reuben Diaz Jr., State Senator Jeffrey Klein, State Assemblyman Michael Benedetto, NYC Councilman James Vacca, asking for their full support and funding of this project and that this resolution be brought before the full board for consideration.

Principal Racic as well as our guests from PS14 also raised the issue that not enough resources seem to be available in the school for evaluations regarding student mental health and developmental services. The committee will bring this up at the Health & Human services committee and see if we can add additional services referrals to the cb10 web directory for youth services. They were also asking if perhaps they could have someone who could expedite such services as the need arises. We assured him that the board office has the ability to assist anyone who is having difficulty receiving services and that they could call the office with any problems that may arise.

Another issue that came up is the fact that the Bronx is the only borough without a gifted and talented program for the primary and middle schools. This is something that the board may want to bring up with Department of Education.


Both schools also are having the usual parking problems at drop off and pick times. Principal Racic asked if we could ask for relaxed enforcement on the Throggs Neck Blvd side of IS192 from 8 am – 8:30 and from 2:10 pm – 3 pm.

TNCAP is working on the issue of prescription drug abuse. The United States is the largest prescription drug abuser in the world. They are working with Governor Cuomo to combat the issue

The committee has decided that they will once again hold the essay contest in honor of youth day in April. It was decided that this year we would gear it to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. We will have more details for the board as we develop the program.









This photo was taken of us from the middle of the playground






