NOTICE OF EXAMINATION

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SPECIALIST - EMT (FIRE DEPARTMENT) Exam No. 1000

WHEN TO APPLY: From: July 7, 2010
To: July 30, 2010

APPLICATION FEE: \$35.00
Payable by mail by money order to D.C.A.S.
(EXAMS) or payable online by credit card, bank card,
or debit card.

WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES: Emergency Medical Specialist - EMTs, under general supervision, perform tasks such as the following: provide timely, professional pre-hospital emergency medical care/Basic Life Support (BLS) to anyone who requests/requires it; provide transportation to the appropriate medical facility; operate department vehicles; receive, prioritize and dispatch calls for emergency medical assistance; and provide patient care under the authorization of the Medical Director. All work is performed in accordance with FDNY policies and procedures and as legislatively prescribed in the requisite curriculum and allowed by Federal/New York State/Regional Protocols and in accordance with the level of training, New York State designated scope of practice and New York State and Regional BLS Protocols. Emergency Medical Specialist - EMTs also prepare and submit reports as required, and may be assigned to work in any FDNY facility, as needed. All personnel perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Emergency Medical Specialist - EMTs and environmental conditions experienced are: working outdoors in all kinds of weather; climbing stairs; using such devices as stair chair or ambulance stretcher; treating patients who may have infectious and communicable diseases; working for extended periods during the day or night in ambulances; driving an ambulance in all kinds of weather; working in confined spaces such as under vehicles, trains, and buildings; working at hazardous material scenes such as a chemical spill or an industrial fire or accident; treating patients at heights such as rooftops, bridges or elevated highways; and reading a Mobile Data Terminal for call information and instructions in varying light conditions.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY: The current minimum salary is \$31,931 per annum. This rate is subject to change.

HOW TO APPLY: If you believe that you meet the requirements in the "How to Qualify" section, you must submit an application using one of the following options:

- (1) **Online at the DCAS WEBSITE:** Go to the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs and follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application and completing any required forms. The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or prepaid debit card which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets.
- (2) **By mail:** Refer to the "Required Forms" section below for the forms that you must fill out. Return the completed forms and the application fee to DCAS Application Unit, 1 Centre Street, 14th floor, New York, NY 10007.

DCAS will not accept applications in person from candidates.

Special Circumstances Form: This form is included in the application package and located online at the above DCAS website. It gives important information about claiming Veterans or Legacy credit, and notifying DCAS of a change in your mailing address. Follow all instructions on the Special Circumstances form that pertain to you when you complete your Application for Examination.

You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the qualification requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are marked "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

HOW TO QUALIFY:

By the **last day of the Application Period** you must have:

- (1) a four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent approved by a State's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization; and
- (2) a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Basic Certification; or
- (3) a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Paramedic Certification.

You must also possess these certificates at the time of your appointment, and they must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

REQUIREMENTS TO BE APPOINTED:

Certificate Requirements: As stated in the "HOW TO QUALIFY" section above, you must possess a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Basic Certification or a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Paramedic Certification by the end of the application period. You must also possess a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Basic Certification or a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Paramedic Certification at the time you are appointed to this position and must maintain them for the duration of your employment.

Driver License Requirement: You must have a motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York at the time of appointment. This license must be maintained for the duration of your employment. Serious moving violations, license suspensions or accident record may disqualify you. Also, you must successfully complete the Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) prior to the completion of one year in title.

Respirator Equipment Requirement: Because you must be able to wear a NIOSH-certified respirator, you are not permitted to have facial hair that interferes with the sealing surface of the respirator and the face or interferes with the valve function of the respirator.

Medical and Psychological Assessment: Medical and psychological guidelines have been established for the position of Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT. You will be examined to determine whether you can perform the essential functions of an Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT. Additionally, you will be expected to continue to perform the essential functions of an Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT throughout your career, and may, therefore, be medically and psychologically tested periodically throughout your career. Where appropriate, a reasonable accommodation will be provided for a person with a disability to enable him or her to take these medical and psychological examinations, and/or to perform the essential functions of the job.

Character and Background: In accordance with the provisions of the State Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Code - Part 800, candidates for EMS certification or recertification must not have been convicted of certain misdemeanors or felonies. The New York State Department of Health (DOH) will review all criminal convictions from any federal, military or state jurisdiction to determine if such convictions fall within the scope of those specified in Part 800, or represent a potential risk or danger to patients or the public at large. You must present the NYS DOH clearance letter to be appointed. For more information, contact the DOH website at www.health.state.ny.us/nysdoh/ems/main.htm or telephone (212) 417-4455. In addition to this provision of the State Emergency Medical Services Code, candidates for this position are advised that good character and satisfactory background are absolute prerequisites to appointment.

Residency: City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement: You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity: Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with the City of New York.

Drug Screening Requirement: You must pass a drug screening in order to be appointed. Random drug screening may be conducted for the duration of your Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT career.

Qualifying Physical Test: Physical standards have been established for the position of Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT. You will be required to pass a qualifying physical test, and may be required to undergo periodic physical testing throughout your career.

Note: If you are presently serving as a Provisional Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT with the FDNY and have previously taken and passed the qualifying physical test, you will not be required to take it again to qualify for appointment.

REQUIRED FORMS:

- 1. Application for Examination:** Make sure that you follow all instructions included with your application form, including payment of fee. Save a copy of the instructions for future reference.
- 2. Education and Experience Test Paper:** Fill out Sections **A.1, A.2, A.6, B** and **C**. This form must be filled out completely and in detail for you to receive your proper rating. Keep a copy of your completed Education and Experience Test Paper for your records. **If you are applying by mail**, write your social security number in the box at the top right side of the cover page, and the examination title and number in the box provided. **If you are applying online**, follow the online instructions.

Note: You must list information about your EMT certificates in “Section C - Licenses and Certificates” on your Education and Experience Test Paper.

- 3. Foreign Education Fact Sheet (Required only if you need credit for your foreign education to meet the education and experience requirements):** If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. The services that are approved to make this evaluation are listed on the Foreign Education Fact Sheet included with your application packet. When you contact the evaluation service, ask for a **"document-by-document" (general)** evaluation of your foreign education. You must have one of these services submit its evaluation of your foreign education directly to the Department of Citywide Administrative Services no later than eight weeks from the last date for applying for this examination.

THE TEST: Your score will be determined by an education and experience test. You will receive a score of 70.000 points for meeting the education and certificate requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100.000 points on the following basis:

For full-time paid experience working as an EMT or Paramedic with the NYC 911 system for: **You will receive:**

At least 3 months, but less than 6 months	5.000 points
At least 6 months, but less than 1 year	10.000 points
At least 1 year, but less than 2 years	20.000 points
2 or more years	25.000 points

For full-time paid experience working as an EMT or Paramedic with a government-run ambulance system outside of NYC 911, or with a volunteer or private ambulance company: **You will receive:**

At least 1 year of experience	5.000 points
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For successful completion, within the last 5 years, of: **You will receive:**

Emergency Vehicle Operators Course (EVOC), consistent with the 1995 National Standard Curriculum	5.000 points
24 hours of HazMat Operations Level Training, consistent with federal OSHA regulations at 29 CFR 1910.120(q)(6)(ii)	5.000 points

EVOC and/or HazMat Training must be successfully completed by **the last day of the application period**. HazMat Training must be to the Operations Level; you will not receive credit for entry-level training.

You will receive a maximum of one year of experience credit for each year you worked. If you have any of the above experience on a part-time basis, it will be credited according to the equivalent percent of full-time experience. Each year of experience will be credited under only one category which will be the highest appropriate category.

Experience must be obtained by **the last day of the application period**.

THE TEST RESULTS: If you pass the education and experience test, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list and you will be given a list number. You will be notified by mail of your test results. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for appointment when your name is reached on the eligible list.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Application Receipt: If you are applying online, you will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, contact this agency at OASys@dcas.nyc.gov. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your email. If you are applying by mail, you will be mailed a receipt within three months of the last date of the application period. If you do not receive this item, write to this agency, Attention: Examining Service Section, 1 Centre Street, 14th floor, New York, NY 10007 to request verification that your application was received. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your request.

Probationary Period: The probationary period is 12 months. As part of the probationary period, probationers will be required to successfully complete a prescribed training course. Probationers who fail to successfully complete the training course may be terminated by the agency head.

EMS Academy Assessment: As a condition of completing EMS Academy training, you must pass multiple-choice exams, quizzes, scenarios and New York State written and practical exams.

Note: If you are presently serving as a provisional Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT with the FDNY and have previously taken and passed the written and practical tests, you will not be required to complete the EMS Academy Assessment again.

The General Examination Regulations of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services apply to this examination and are part of this Notice of Examination.
