

Technical Notes about Census 2000 Selected Employment Characteristics Tables and Charts

Occupation for the Employed Civilian Population

Employed residents, age 16 years and over, are listed by occupation categories for census tracts in each community district. Occupations are grouped into five major categories. Pie charts illustrate percentages by occupation for the district, borough and the city. Occupations in the five major categories include:

1. Management, Professional, and Related Occupations

- Management occupations
- Business and Financial Operations occupations
 - Business operations specialists
 - Financial specialists
- Professional and related occupations
 - Computer and mathematical occupations
 - Architecture and engineering occupations
 - Life, physical, and social science occupations
 - Community and social services occupations
 - Legal occupations
 - Education, training, and library occupations
 - Arts, design, entertainment, sports and media occupations
 - Healthcare practitioners and technical occupations

2. Service Occupations

- Healthcare support occupations
- Protective service occupations
 - Fire fighting, prevention, law enforcement workers and others (including supervisors)
 - Other protective service workers
- Food preparation and serving related occupations
- Building and grounds cleaning and maintenance occupations
- Personal care occupations

3. Sales and Office Occupations

- Sales and related occupations
- Office and administrative support occupations

4. Construction, Extraction, and Maintenance Occupations

- Construction trades workers (including supervisors)
- Extraction workers
- Installation, maintenance, and repair occupations

5. Production, Transportation, and Material Moving Occupations

- Production occupations
- Transportation and material moving workers (including supervisors)
 - Aircraft and traffic control workers
 - Motor vehicle operators
 - Rail, water, and other transportation occupations

Industry of Total Workers by Place of Work

The industry of workers, age 16 years and over (persons employed at work during the week prior to enumeration), regardless of residence, are listed by census tract of workplace within the community district. Workers are grouped into seven industry categories. Pie charts illustrate percentages by industry for the district, borough and the city.

Important Confidentiality and Data Notes: the Census Bureau does not disclose any information that would permit identification of any particular establishment, individual, or household. To this end, the Census Bureau's Disclosure Review Board uses a number of different disclosure avoidance techniques including: data-rounding, top-coding, thresholds, data suppression and other techniques. As a result, some of the data in these tables have been modified and the sum of the categories may not add to the total.
