




16NYCRR Part 753

#### **Code 753**


- Call 811 Before You Dig (753-3.1)
  - 2 to 10 working days before excavation begins.
- Wait The Required Time (753-3.1(a)(2))
  - Operator has two business days to identify facilities.
- Confirm Utility Response via Automated Positive Response System (753-3.3(d))
  - When in doubt, inquire about the mark out.
- Maintain The Marks (753-3.5) and Dig With Care(753-3.6(b))
  - Maintain/refresh markouts so they remain visible even during digging.

### **APR Lookup in NYC**






#### APR Lookup in NYC - Copy of One Call and APR Response





# **Excavation Safety**

- Hand dig to expose gas and electric facilities within the tolerance zones. (753-3.6(b))
- Once exposed, support and protect including. (753-3.12)
- Keep spoils away from open excavation.
- Limit mechanized equipment within 4" of an exposed facility. (753-3.8)



### **What If A Damage Occurs?**

• If a Gas or Electric or Steam Facility is damaged, exit and clear the excavation safely. Immediately contact Con Edison. (753-3.10(b)&(c))

#### What If A Damage Occurs?

- If a gas or steam facility is damaged do not operate and or turn off any valves.
- If the electric facility is damaged, try to keep water out of the excavation
- <u>No backfilling</u> shall be done by the excavator in the vicinity of the damage until the operator inspects and makes any necessary repairs. The <u>excavator shall undertake</u> <u>no repairs</u>.(753-3.10(d))
- Repairs must be performed by Con Edison Operator qualified Mechanics.



# <u>Department of Finance (DOF) Collection</u>

- DOF sent out notices of open debt
- Permittee's placed on hold by DOT
- Hold cannot be released unless
  - Payment is made in full
  - Permittee enters into a payment schedule with DOF
- Way to pay to release hold:
  - Call DOF:
    - 212-440-5300
    - Select Option #2
    - Follow Instructions of How to Pay or make a Payment Plan
    - <u>BE PATIENT</u>, Someone will either pick up or you can leave message. DOF will call you back

# NEW 0135 PERMIT

Now called <u>CAR Restoration</u> Permit formerly known as Final Restoration Permit.

Permit will be used to repair certain codes on CARs only:


-50-Temp Mounded 51-Temp Sunken

-70-Perm Mounded 71-Perm Sunken

-80-Overdue for Final 90-Builder Pavement

-62-RRM Paving Req.

- Permit Application Requirement
  - Must indicate Corrective Action Request (CAR) number
  - Validation
    - Valid number and open status
    - Correct Permittee
    - Correct location
  - Must submit DOT approved <u>As Built Form aka Cutform</u>
  - Multiple 0135 permits CANNOT be taken out for the same CAR number
- HIQA-CARs will be issued "first" on any overdue for final restoration.

# Revision to permit stips to deal with parking

- I would like to discuss the contractors need to reserve parking to perform work and the possibility of including a new stip, or revising stip 078. The requested revision would allow the contractor to maintain material/barricades in the parking lane only when used to reserve parking to perform work.
- The current issue is that we are getting denied Stip 20 which would allow us to store material. I have included a recent summons as an example
