### **Board of Directors**

Members of the Board of Directors of the Hudson Yards Infrastructure Corporation serve ex-officio

#### Director of the New York City Office of Management and Budget - Dean Fuleihan

Dean A. Fuleihan was appointed Director of the New York City Office of Management and Budget in January of 2014. Previously, Mr. Fuleihan joined the SUNY College of Nanoscale Science and Engineering as Executive Vice President for Strategic Partnerships. Prior to that, he served in the New York State Assembly for over 30 years, serving as the principal fiscal and policy advisor to the Speaker of the New York State Assembly, Assembly leadership and the Majority Conference. He was also the Assembly's principal staff negotiator on the state budget. Mr. Fuleihan received a B.A. degree in Economics from Alfred University and studied public finance at the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University.

#### New York City Comptroller – Scott Stringer

Scott M. Stringer, the Comptroller of the City of New York, was elected to a four-year term on November 5, 2013 and took office on January 1, 2014. As Comptroller, Mr. Stringer is the chief fiscal officer of the City and has extensive investigative and audit powers and responsibilities which include keeping the financial books and records of the City, as well as a program of performance audits of City agencies in connection with the City's management, planning and control of operations. Mr. Stringer is required to evaluate the Mayor's budget, including the assumptions and methodology used in the budget. Under the City Charter and pursuant to State law and City investment guidelines, Mr. Stringer is responsible for managing and investing City funds for operating and capital purposes. He is jointly responsible, with the Mayor, for City debt issuance and management. Mr. Stringer is also a member of the Control Board and is a trustee, the custodian and the delegated investment advisor of the City's five pension systems. Prior to becoming Comptroller, Mr. Stringer was elected to the New York State Assembly in 1992, representing Manhattan's West Side for 13 years, and won election in 2005 as Manhattan Borough President. Mr. Stringer was born and raised in Washington Heights, where he attended local public schools and graduated from John Jay College of Criminal Justice.

#### City Council Speaker – Melissa Mark-Viverito

Melissa Mark-Viverito currently serves as the Speaker of the New York City Council, the first Puerto Rican and Latina to hold a citywide elected position. She represents the 8th District, which includes El Barrio/East Harlem and the South Bronx. Speaker Mark-Viverito was born and raised in San Juan, Puerto Rico. She worked for over a decade in local activism, nonprofit organizations and labor before being elected to the City Council in 2005, as the first Puerto Rican woman and Latina to represent her district in the Council. In 2009, she was elected to her second term in the City Council, during which she served as Chair of the Committee on Parks and Recreation, the founding Co-Chair of the Progressive Caucus and as a member of the Black, Latino and Asian Caucus. In 2011, she was one of four Council Members to pioneer the first-ever Participatory Budgeting process in New York City. She is a graduate of Columbia College

at Columbia University and Baruch College, City University of New York, where she studied Public Administration through the National Urban Fellows Program.

#### Deputy Mayor for Economic Development– Alicia Glen

Deputy Mayor Alicia Glen leads the administration's efforts to invest in emerging industries across the five boroughs, build a new generation of affordable housing, and help New Yorkers secure good-paying jobs that can support a family. Ms. Glen served as the Assistant Commissioner for Housing Finance at the NYC Department of Housing, Preservation and Development from 1998 to 2002, where she was responsible for financing the rehabilitation and construction of thousands of units of market, moderate and low-income units as well as overseeing the City's supportive housing, tax credit and tax incentive programs.

Most recently, Ms. Glen served as the Head of the Urban Investment Group (UIG) at Goldman Sachs, which provides capital to underserved urban communities. Under her leadership, UIG spurred more than \$5 billion of development across dozens of residential, mixed-use and commercial projects, as well as financed job creation and neighborhood revitalization strategies like the \$40mm New York Healthy Food and Healthy Communities Fund. Ms. Glen is a graduate of Amherst College and Columbia Law School.

#### Mayor for Operations – Anthony Shorris

Anthony E. Shorris currently serves as First Deputy Mayor of the City of New York. Prior to that, he was Vice Dean, Senior Vice President and Chief of Staff of the NYU Langone Medical Center. Before serving at the Medical Center, Shorris was a member of the faculty of the Robert F. Wagner School of Public Service and Director of the Rudin Center for Transportation Policy. From 2003 to 2007, he taught at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs, where he also directed the Policy Research Institute for the Region (PRIOR). Mr. Shorris held the Frederick H. Schultz Class of 1951 Professor of International Economic Policy chair at Princeton during 2003 to 2004. From 1984 to 1988, Shorris served as New York City's deputy budget director, acting as an architect of Mayor Edward I. Koch's Ten Year Housing Plan. He would go on to serve as the City's Finance Commissioner from 1987 to 1989.

From 1991 to 1995, Mr. Shorris served as First Deputy Executive Director of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey. Mr. Shorris subsequently served as the 11th Executive Director of the Port Authority from 2007 to 2008. During his tenure, the agency acquired Stewart Airport and continued the reconstruction of the World Trade Center. From 2000 to 2003, Shorris served as Deputy Chancellor for Operations and Policy at the Board of Education of the City of New York under chancellors Harold O. Levy and Joel I. Klein. In 2006 to 2007, he also led the development of Governor Eliot Spitzer's education reform initiative while serving as senior policy advisor to the transition. He taught classes on education economics and policy during his tenure on the faculty of the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University. Mr. Shorris's work on education, infrastructure, and financial management has been published by the New York Times, the Newark Star-Ledger, the Nation Magazine, and the Century Foundation.

## **Officers**

### President – Alan L. Anders

Mr. Anders was appointed President in October 2006. Mr. Anders also serves as Deputy Director for Finance of the Office of Management and Budget of the City. Prior to joining the City in September 1990, Mr. Anders was a senior investment banker for J.P. Morgan Securities since 1977 and prior to that date was Executive Director of the Commission on Governmental Efficiency and Economy in Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. Anders is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Maryland Law School.

### Vice President and Treasurer – F. Jay Olson

Mr. Olson was appointed Vice President and Treasurer in October 2006. He previously served as Deputy Treasurer. He is a graduate of Northwestern University, the University of Texas at Austin, and the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. He also serves as Assistant Director at the Office of Management and Budget of the City.

### Deputy Treasurer – Philip Wasserman

Mr. Wasserman was appointed Deputy Treasurer in January 2009. He is a graduate of Cornell University, the University of Texas at Austin and Columbia University. He also serves as Assistant Director at the Office of Management and Budget of the City. He is also a Professional Engineer.

### Secretary – Prescott D. Ulrey

Mr. Ulrey was appointed Secretary in September 2013. He previously served as Assistant Secretary. He is a graduate of the University of California at Berkeley, the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University and Columbia Law School. He also serves as General Counsel at the Office of Management and Budget of the City.

### Assistant Secretary – Jeffrey M. Werner

Mr. Werner was appointed Assistant Secretary in January 2005. He is a graduate of Bowdoin College and Columbia Law School. He also serves as Deputy General Counsel at the Office of Management and Budget of the City.

### Comptroller – Robert L. Balducci

Mr. Balducci was appointed Comptroller in May 2014. He previously served as Deputy Comptroller. He is a graduate of Baruch College of the City University of New York. He also serves as Assistant Director at the Office of Management and Budget of the City.
