


FIRST REFORMED CHURCH AND SUNDAY SCHOOL OF COLLEGE POINT,
118-09 14th Avenue, COLLEGE POINT, QUEENS.

These two charming church structures were built in 1872-74 to serve the First Reformed Church of College Point. Both are wood frame buildings designed in a manner reflecting the traditions of rural architecture -- a reminder of the character of College Point at that time. The church building with its round-arched openings and paneled corner piers displays characteristics of the Italianate style. A small pedimented entrance porch provides access through a tower with a soaring spire. The Sunday School building is a rare and well-preserved example of the Eastlake Gothic style in New York City. Intricate carved ornament, pointed-arch openings, ornamental bargeboards, and a small towered entrance porch are among the distinctive features of the building.
