**Re: Request for “No Turn on Red” Signs at Lincoln Tunnel Access Points**

Dear Mr. Fulton,

Manhattan Community Board 4 (CB4) requests the assistance of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (PANYNJ) with the installation of additional “No Turn on Red Signs” at access points to and from the Lincoln Tunnel. Residents have complained about drivers around the Lincoln Tunnel making illegal left turns against the red light. CB4 believes that additional “No Turn on Red” signs will help correct this situation and improve the safety of our streets. We recommend of the installation of signage at the following intersections:

- 36th Street and Ninth Avenue
- 35th Street and Dyer Avenue
- 35th Street and 10th Avenue
- 34th Street and Dyer Avenue
- 40th Street and Dyer Avenue
- 41st Street and Dyer Avenue
- 41st Street and 9th Avenue
- 42nd street and Dyer Avenue

In accordance with the the mission of the New York City Vision Zero initiative “death and injury on city streets is not acceptable.” Safer streets are the only

way for New York City to achieve its goal of zero pedestrian fatalities or injuries, and the area around the Lincoln Tunnel has proved to be particularly dangerous. With your assistance, the installation of additional “No Turn on Red Signs” will greatly improve the safety of our streets.
