## TLC APPROVES SECOND PARTICIPANT IN THE VEHICLE SAFETY TECHNOLOGY PILOT

Today, the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC) approved a second participant in the Vehicle Safety Technology Pilot: **Mobileye**.

A Vision Zero initiative, the Vehicle Safety Technology Pilot will test and evaluate the efficacy of black boxes, anti-speeding technologies, driver alert systems, and related analytic software, in promoting safe driving of TLC-regulated vehicles.

The Pilot began on April 7, 2015 and will last a full year, ending on April 6, 2016. TLC will continue accepting applications throughout the Pilot, and will issue additional industry notices as participants are approved.
