

Paratransit Vehicle Fact Sheet: Regarding rule §60A-34

1) Vehicle Retirement 2) New Permit / Vehicle Transfer applications

VEHICLE RETIREMENT:

- In order to renew your vehicle permit there is a retirement schedule that must be followed.
Please see important dates below.
- The vehicle must be retired from service by the expiration date of the vehicle permit AND must retire according to the following schedule.

Example: If the vehicle license expires on 1/31/14, on renewal, a vehicle of model 2008 or newer vehicle must be placed into service.

<i>Permit Expiration Date</i>	<i>Vehicle Model Years to be Retired</i>
On and after 01/01/2012	All paratransit vehicles shall be retired no less than seven (7) years after the vehicle was first licensed .

NEW PERMIT APPLICATIONS & VEHICLE TRANSFERS:

- As of January 1st, 2011, if you apply for a **new paratransit vehicle license** or when you apply to **replace your vehicle**, your vehicle must meet the mileage requirements below.

<i>New Permit or Transfer Application Date</i>	<i>Mileage Requirement - Vehicle shall have been driven LESS THAN:</i>
On and after 01/01/2011	500 miles; AND, all qualified replacement paratransit vehicles must be of the most recent model year or the immediately preceding model year.

Example: An application for a transfer or new application submitted on 01/03/2014 must be model year 2013 or 2014 AND with no more than 500 miles as noted on the MC300. The MC 300 cannot be more than one month prior to the paratransit vehicle licensing.

NOTE: A paratransit vehicle that cannot pass the New York State Department of Transportation inspection must be retired, regardless of whether its retirement date has been reached. A paratransit vehicle which has reached its retirement date must be retired, regardless of whether it may still pass the New York State Department of Transportation inspection.

REGARDING REQUESTING AN EXTENSION

Extension requests will be accepted only if they adhere to the following criteria:

- 1) The request must be submitted in writing **no less than two (2) months** before the vehicle's expiration date.
- 2) The request must include documentation demonstrating that a new vehicle has been ordered and will not be delivered until after, but no later than **sixty (60) days** after, the vehicle's expiration date.

Any request which fails to follow these rules will be rejected. **Extension requests must be mailed to:**
