## remove barriers, and expand diversity

Greetings,

New York City is attempting to "level the playing field" for qualified jobseekers with prior convictions. It is now required for all human service providers entering into contracts with the City to refrain from inquiring about the criminal background of job applicants at their organizations until after the jobseeker's first interview. We respectfully request that you join us for a half-day seminar that will cover what these changes mean for your organization, guidance on current laws for considering criminal convictions when hiring, and why this change is important for New York City and the communities you serve. Some positions at your organization may be exempt because of the nature of the work and the imperative for safety.

In conjunction with the Human Services Council and Fortune Society, we will be hosting two remaining training symposia between 9:30 AM and 12:30 PM on the following dates:
